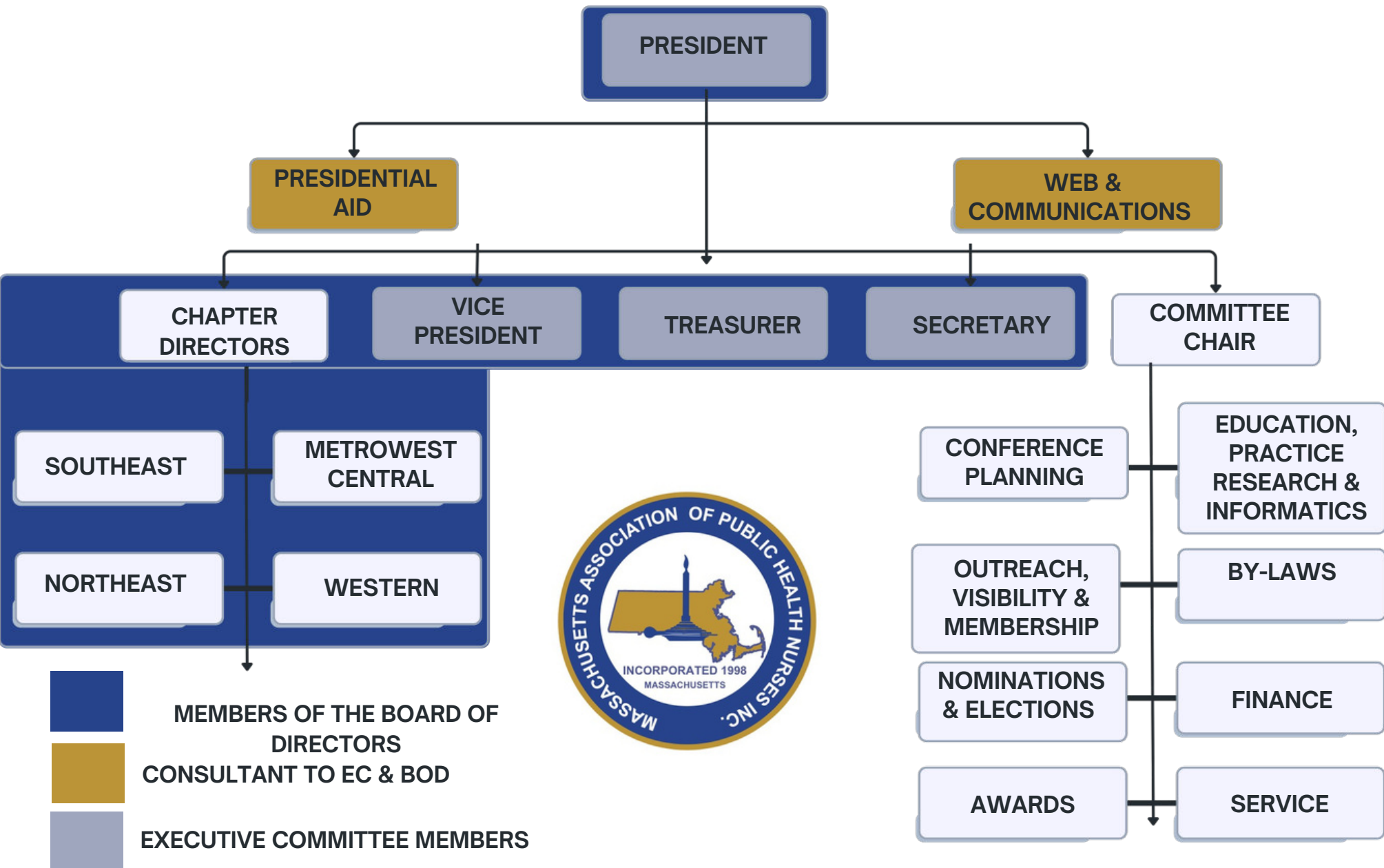

July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026

FY26 was a year of planning and transition for the Massachusetts Association of Public Health Nurses. We completed a strategic planning process informed by member and stakeholder input, advanced a substantial bylaws revision, and continued to represent public health nursing in statewide discussions. We also held our annual conference, expanded practical resources for members and families, and used our public communications to make members' work more visible.

Strategic planning and governance

The Executive Team worked with BME Strategies and Dr. Victoria Beltran on a strategic planning process that included focus groups, interviews, and opportunities for members to identify what they need from MAPHN. Advocacy emerged as a leading priority. The process gave us a clearer basis for decisions about member engagement, education, visibility, and the support required to carry out those priorities. Completing the plan was a major FY26 milestone.

The bylaws transition was closely connected to that work. Revising the bylaws required significant time from the Board and Executive Committee, along with member discussion and feedback. They establish an updated mission and vision, revise membership and officer provisions, clarify Board and chapter responsibilities, and explicitly assign the Board a role in implementing and assessing the strategic plan. This is a meaningful governance step, though the transition will require supporting procedures and consistent communication with chapters and members.

Statewide representation and advocacy

On December 3, 2025, I was invited to represent MAPHN at Governor Maura Healey and Commissioner Robbie Goldstein's forum on strengthening trust in childhood vaccines and to stand with them during the press conference. The discussion addressed concerns about the childhood immunization schedule, including hepatitis B, vaccine misinformation, and the resources communities need to maintain trust and access. I spoke about the role public health nurses play through clinics, health fairs, and services delivered in the communities they serve. MAPHN's inclusion gave local public health nursing a voice in a high profile statewide conversation.

MAPHN also joined other Massachusetts nursing organizations and state leaders in opposing proposed federal student loan caps and the proposed treatment of graduate nursing degrees. Our December 2025 public statement connected access to advanced nursing education with workforce capacity and community care. The Executive Committee's 2025–2026 president's statement likewise affirmed MAPHN's support for science-based care, vaccines, Medicaid, and access to preventive services.

Education, partnerships, and member engagement

MAPHN held its annual conference in Springfield on May 13–14, 2026, under the theme **"Building Resilience in Public Health Nursing."** The annual meeting was scheduled during the conference with a virtual option for members. Conference planning and the bylaws work placed considerable demands on volunteer leaders this year; both efforts showed the value of clear roles and additional policy and operational support as the association moves into implementation.

- Promoted a joint educational event with the Massachusetts Association of Occupational Health Nurses at the Public Health Museum in April 2026 and introduced new MAPHN apparel in May.

Since January 1 st , 2026, 52 programs offering 123.5 contact hours of education were approved. Since July 1 st , 2025, there were 71 programs which offered 176.5 contact hours of education. There have been no “education committee” meetings since application and forms were updated in early 2025.

Since the by-laws revision at the Annual Meeting 2026, I would recommend that the contact

hour certificate be revised removing “Education Chair” and substituting MAPHN (see below) or full text Massachusetts Association of Public Health Nurses.
